## Traits of Domination and Partnership Paradigms in Diversity, Equality & Inclusion



## **Domination Traits:**

- Authoritarian leadership by teachers or administrators.
- Lack of transparency in school decisions.
- Competition and favoritism among students.
- Suppression of marginalized voices and opinions.
- One-way communication from teacher to student.
- Control-oriented discipline practices.

## **Partnership Traits:**

- Shared leadership among teachers, students, and parents.
- Transparency and openness in decision-making.
- Cooperation and mutual support among all students.
- Encouragement of diverse voices and perspectives.
- Two-way communication between teachers and students.
- Empowerment and restorative discipline practices.

## **Shifting Traits Using NVC:**

- From Authoritarian to Shared Leadership: Use NVC to invite participation and shared decision-making in the classroom and school.
- From Lack of Transparency to Openness: Communicate openly about school processes and decisions.
- From Competition and Favoritism to Cooperation: Foster a culture of mutual support through empathetic communication among students.
- From Suppression to Encouragement of Voices: Value and incorporate diverse student perspectives.
- From One-way to Two-way Communication: Engage in dialogues where all voices are heard.
- From Control to Empowerment: Empower students by addressing their needs and making collaborative requests.
